




- We live longer, have fewer children



- The oldest women and men in Sweden are 85 or older

 - Taught not to be open about who they are



Not being allowed to transition

- Yes I was, but when they heard that I had atrial fibrillation and a pacemaker and took a lot of heart medicine and Varan, yes, then [the doctor] just put down the pen and said "you can forget about that, because no one will put a knife in you if it's not absolutely necessary." And then I tried to get plastic surgery, too, but I got a "no" there as well. (Lena)
- Yes, then she said to me, "You only have 20 years left to live." It was like a black shadow. I never thought about it like that. It was like a punch in the face. And I thought, okay, now you said that and I don't care so much about it, but it could have affected me. You have to be careful with what you say and how you say things. 




Differences in physical health disappear when controlling for mental health disparities

Words and terminology

- Queer (here) used here as an umbrella term for gay and bisexual cis-men
- Age 50 as the definition of old in (earlier) HIV/AIDS research
- September 18: National HIV/AIDS and Aging Awareness Day





The empirical study

- In-depth interviews with four queer men in the San Francisco Bay Area 2007-2008
- Interpretive phenomenology
- 61-74 years old
- 3 Whites, 1 Latino
- 3 singles
- 1 PLWH





Survivors and the ones left behind



A Special Time



... There were a lot of nice things going on at the time, but that put a scare on everybody. The Castro, whole district changed. It wasn't the same but of course it's going to change, but a lot of people seemed to be more paranoid about it and catching diseases. (Francis)



The '80s and early '90s were unlike any other time. Because to be a gay man at that time was just to live with death every day. I mean, you would look at people in the gym, and in a month they were gone. You'd see someone on the street, and the next day everyone was crashing, and it was a time of fear, desperation. People were *trying anything.* (Peter)






An Embodied disease

But walking up and down the streets and seeing people with Kaposi's sarcoma was not too nice, I mean. And there were plenty of people who had it ...uh, there was a certain fear about it too, of course. (Steve)



Treatments as trials

I remembered that roommate, at the time, he was taking a photography class and they had to do a self portrait. He did a self-portrait of all the AZT pills. He took them and laid them like in a circle on the dining room table and then superimposed his face onto the thing because it was so describing what he was dealing with at the time. (Timothy)





The repeated losses



When it was at its worst with people dying. I mean, just people were just dying, dying, dying, dying, dying. Lost a whole handful of friends in that time. It was really a painful, stressful time. (Peter)

It just like you became numb to it, just as we became numb to the nightly news reports during the Vietnam War of another hundred soldiers were killed... But, I think we became numb to it and you became numb to every weekend there was another memorial service to sing at. (Timothy)



Ghost-like existence



Suddenly, I am a ghost



...all of my inner circle of people I knew in West Palm Beach are all dead. You know, so it's like-- I mean, I have nothing to go back there to see. There's no one who remembers me. There's no one I can sit down and joke about stories and tell all the crazy things. It's as though I didn't live there. In West Palm Beach, I'm a ghost. (Peter)



Life among ghosts

I actually moved here because it was time to leave New York. New York was filled with ghosts. [---] And walking the streets of the neighborhoods that I knew so well, it was almost like I was seeing ghosts, you know, not literally, but it was too many heavy memories of people that were no longer around, most of whom had died, although some had moved away. (Timothy)






